Frequently Asked Questions...

on sending your child to a sahaj school

We went to each school individually and asked the principals some questions which many parents have when considering sending their child to a sahaj school. Here are their answers; We hope you find them enlightening!



1. What is the process for your school to accept new students?

Vienna Kindergarten: The first thing the parents must do is put their child on the waiting list. We have two groups with 14 children in each group. The first group is for children 1.5-3 years old and the second group is for 3.5-6 years old...

2. As a parent, How do I know if my child is ready to attend your school?

Canajoharie School: The child should have a pure desire to attend the school, as well as the parent(s) should have the pure desire to send their child to the school...

DEVI School: Students who thrive at the DEVI School are those who are already meditating, who understand the value of their chastity and the brother/sister relationship, and are keen to deepen their relationship with the Divine...
